Keeping Brisbane moving

Brisbane's New Bus Network has been purpose-built for Brisbane to provide you with public transport our growing city deserves.

Travelling from the suburbs to the city is a daily commute for many and our network should be easy to understand and use.

That's why as part of your new bus network we're introducing the turn-up-and-go Brisbane Metro - a high-frequency, high-capacity bus rapid transit system operating along our dedicated busways.

Brisbane Metro will form the core of our new bus network with the first two lines servicing 18 stations through the CBD and south east Brisbane, unlocking greater capacity on our network.

As part of your new bus network, we've also focused on decongesting CBD bus services and simplifying routes to help you get where you need to go at the times you want to travel.

You shared your feedback on the proposed network changes in 2022, and since then we've been refining the bus network to deliver you more services, more often.

This is just one of the ways we're providing more travel options to keep Brisbane moving today and into the future.

Keeping Brisbane moving

Brisbane City Council is committed to providing a world-class transport network that is connected, reliable and accessible, to encourage more people to leave their car behind and ease congestion.

To deliver on this vision, we're improving and expanding Brisbane's public transport network to meet our city's growing and evolving needs for today and the future.

In Brisbane, buses do the heavy lifting, carrying two-thirds of public transport passengers. As our city continues to grow, we need to rethink our bus network and invest in smart solutions to keep Brisbane moving.

We're making the step change from public transport to mass transit, with the introduction of Brisbane Metro, a bus rapid transit (BRT) system. Brisbane Metro will complement our new bus network and provide high-capacity, high-frequency travel options that are purpose-built for our city.

By making these changes, we're moving more people, more often – as well as laying the foundation for future stages of turn-up-and-go services.



Supercharging the bus network with Brisbane Metro

Brisbane Metro is the step change we need to deliver the high-frequency, turn-up-and-go bus network that our city deserves.

Brisbane Metro is a high-capacity bus rapid transit (BRT) system built on our city's network of dedicated busways. The first two metro lines will service 18 stations through the CBD and south east Brisbane.

The electric metros don't require overhead wires or tracks, meaning future lines can be constructed much faster than other transport modes.

Stage one of Brisbane Metro will operate from Eight Mile Plains to Roma Street (M1), and Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital to University of Queensland (M2).

This city-shaping project will encourage more people to leave their car behind and get on board public transport,

with easier links to bus and train services, and new and improved purpose-built infrastructure to make it easier for people to travel around Brisbane.

Brisbane has grown faster than any other Australian capital over the past decade and with only eight years left to prepare for the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games, we're not just planning for today, but for the future.

The Brisbane Metro expansion program is planned to extend to Brisbane's north, east, south and to the airport, creating opportunities for more turn-up-and-go services across our growing city.



Brisbane Metro - bus rapid transit (BRT) expansion program

Expanding Brisbane Metro will strengthen the high-frequency core of our mass transit network by:

- Delivering high-capacity and high-frequency bus services
- Connecting key precincts and increasing connectivity with our suburbs, providing more travel options
- Offering inclusive world-class onboard accessibility features.

Southern Metro - CBD to Springwood

Complementing the extension of the South East Busway to connect to Metro 1 at Eight Mile Plains busway station.

Northern Metro - CBD to Carseldine


Expanding services between central Brisbane and Lutwyche, Kedron, Chermside, Aspley and Carseldine.


Eastern Metro - CBD to Capalaba

Connecting central Brisbane, the eastern suburbs of Brisbane and neighbouring urban areas of Redland City Council.

Airport Metro - CBD to Brisbane Airport

Creating new express connections between Brisbane's international and domestic terminals and the CBD.





Brisbane's New Bus Network

As part of our plan to evolve the bus network, Brisbane's New Bus Network will be introduced to integrate with stage one of metro services.

We know you want buses that are fast, frequent and reliable and Council has been investing in high-frequency and highcapacity services across our network.

The much-loved high-frequency Blue and Maroon CityGliders are proof of Council's investment, but we know we have more to do to make public transport the easiest way to travel around Brisbane.

Due to the size of our bus network, we need to review and modernise the network in stages. Stage one of Brisbane Metro and the new network provides a catalyst for parts of our network in the south-eastern corridor and inner city to evolve.

After in-depth network analysis by our transport planners and extensive consultation with the community, we finalised the bus network in the inner city and south-eastern corridor.

Feedback received on bus services in other parts of the city will inform Council's future planning for additional metro lines or network review.

We're calling the final network Brisbane's New Bus Network and here's what this means:

- ✓ Around 85% of trips will be faster or similar during peak periods
- ✓ Turn-up-and-go Brisbane Metro services arriving every 5-minutes during peak times and 24-hours on weekends
- ✓ New routes, extended all-day services or improved service frequency in our suburbs
- ✓ Faster travel times and less bottlenecks by making better use of our dedicated busways
- ✓ Seamless connections from suburban services to more high-frequency services via same platform transfers
- ✓ Increased connections with rail, creating more interchange opportunities
- ✓ Simpler journeys with consistent locations for services entering and exiting the CBD
- \checkmark A more reliable network so you can leave the car at home.

What we've done since consultation

Council reached an agreement with the State Government to better fund Brisbane's bus network and keep our city moving.

With this investment we will improve the frequency and reliability of bus services for you while expanding services to new suburbs across our bus network. This includes:

- Increasing investment in buses from the State Government and co-funding for metro services
- Collaborating with the State Government to undertake regular network reviews
- Working with the State Government to improve bus to rail connections and deliver a multi-modal network
- Commitment from the Department of Transport and Main Roads and Council to deliver bus priority on key routes.

What's next

To ensure Brisbane's New Bus Network and metro services integrate seamlessly, Council will continue to work closely with the State Government ahead of implementation. This will include:

- Negotiating with the State Government to reach an agreement on the commencement date of Brisbane Metro M1 and M2 and Brisbane's New Bus Network
- Making your suburban network ready for implementation by ensuring we have the bus stops and layover areas required for services
- Completing the construction of new and improved infrastructure – City Hall / King George Square station, Buranda busway station, Griffith University station and Cultural Centre station
- Continuing to test and commission new metros and introduce them to the network
- Improving our on board systems based on customer feedback and further testing
- Working with Translink to get our customers ready to travel on the new network including Journey Planner, timetables, maps, signage and customer support.

A new way to move



Five new bus routes will be added to our network to improve connectivity for customers to key destinations.

This includes improved connections between the South East Busway and Fortitude Valley, new peak period services, and connections to local places of interest.

Consultation outcomes

During consultation, we proposed three new routes – Route 26, Route P109 and Route 182. In response to your feedback, two additional new routes will be implemented. For more detail refer to page 88 for Route 127 and page 164 for Route 197.

New routes

Route 26 – Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to RBWH station via Woolloongabba and Fortitude Valley

This new route will operate every 10-15 minutes in both directions during peak periods, providing direct connections between the South East Busway, Fortitude Valley and RBWH station, bypassing the inner busway and city. This route will also provide more trips to and from Kangaroo Point, and a faster connection when travelling on southern and eastern BUZ routes to Fortitude Valley, and northern BUZ routes to the South East Busway and Woolloongabba station. It will also improve integration between bus and rail services at Fortitude Valley station with a direct connection to RBWH.

Route P109 – Acacia Ridge to City via Ipswich Road

This new service will provide a faster journey in peak hours between Acacia Ridge, Moorooka, Annerley and the city. It will mean more travel options for you on the Ipswich Road corridor providing additional capacity to the city during peak periods. Route P109 will also maintain a direct connection to the city from Acacia Ridge in peak periods.

Route 127 – Indooroopilly to Fairfield Gardens Shopping Centre via Yeronga

This new service will be introduced by Translink, in coordination with Council, to operate between Indooroopilly and Fairfield Gardens Shopping Centre via Yeronga. Route 127 will retain the direct connection between Indooroopilly and Yeronga.

This route will operate as a trial service for two years and will be reviewed by Translink following this trial.

New routes

Route 182 - Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to Holland Park West station via Wishart and Mansfield

The new service means that Wishart and Mansfield will continue to have access to an all-day service following changes to Route 174 – Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to City and Fortitude Valley and Route 185 – Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to city and Fortitude Valley.

This new service will introduce connections from Wishart and Mansfield to local destinations, including Mt Gravatt Plaza. Connectivity to high-frequency metro and busway services will be provided at Holland Park West station and Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City). Additional services to Nursery Road will also provide more travel options for Holland Park West.

Route 197 - South Brisbane to City

This route is being introduced as a loop service to operate between South Brisbane and City via Stephens Road, Merivale Street and Cordelia Street. Route 197 will operate as a trial for a 12-month period. Following the trial, the route will be reviewed.

Redesigning suburban routes

Twelve suburban bus routes will be redesigned to terminate at busway stations, connecting customers to high-frequency metro or busway services.

By reducing the number of suburban buses using the busways into the city, we can ease inner city congestion and free up busway capacity for more metro and high-frequency services. This will allow us to redistribute services to provide coverage in local areas.

A number of suburban routes have also been redesigned to address community feedback and help create a better planned network.

Consultation outcomes

Based on your feedback, there will be changes to the terminating location for four of the twelve routes. Three will terminate at PA Hospital and one will terminate at UQ Lakes station.

Combining duplicated routes

We are establishing high-frequency routes in key suburban corridors by combining duplicated routes without decreasing the total number of trips or coverage.

This will create better, more efficient routes that can be accessed by more people and reduce service duplication.

Consultation outcomes

Following consultation, three peak services that were proposed to be combined into their counterpart all-day services will be retained. For more detail refer to page 62 for Route 114, page 146 for Route 181, and page 192 for Route 376.

The introduction of Brisbane's New Bus Network will aim to make your services more reliable. Currently, three cross-town services operate from the western suburbs to the northern suburbs via the city.

The length of these routes creates reliability issues for customers due to external influences such as traffic congestion.

The new network will divide these long routes so that they finish their service in the city to reduce the likelihood of delays.

City stops serviced by the divided routes will be located in close proximity to make transferring between services simple.

Routes to be divided

The routes that will be divided are:

- Route 375 Bardon to Stafford will be divided into:
 - Route 348 Stafford to City via Lutwyche (a new route number for the northern alignment)
 - Route 375 Bardon to City
- Route 379 Ashgrove to Stafford via Grange will be divided into:
 - Route 347 Stafford to City via Grange (a new route number for the northern alignment)
 - Route 379 Ashgrove to City
- Route 470 Toowong to Teneriffe Ferry will be divided into:
 - Route 470 Toowong to City
 - Route 309 (renumbered from Route 393) RBWH station to City, via Teneriffe.





Routes with low frequencies and low customer demand have been carefully reviewed. We are removing three routes to enable other improvements in the network.

The new network includes alternative services or a nearby high-frequency service to connect you to where you want to go.

Consultation outcomes

During consultation, we proposed to remove two routes - Route 145 and Route P151. In response to other changes, Route 28 will also be removed, with alternative services available. For more detail refer to page 32.

Routes to be removed

Route 28 - Langlands Park to the University of Queensland

This route currently operates during university terms connecting Langlands Park station, Stones Corner station, Buranda busway station through to UQ Lakes station. Route 179 (renumbered from 170) – Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to The University of Queensland has been extended to UQ Lakes station and will provide an alternative travel option when travelling between Buranda station and UQ Lakes station. Route 179 will help maintain capacity and connectivity between Buranda station, PA Hospital station, Boggo Road station and UQ Lakes station.

When travelling between Langlands Park station, Stones Corner station, Buranda station, PA Hospital station, Boggo Road station and UQ Lakes station, you can travel on Route 209 - Carindale to The University of Queensland. When travelling between Buranda station, PA Hospital Station and Boggo Road station and UQ Lakes, there are many alternative high-frequency services, which you can use to complete your journeys.

Route 145 – Browns Plains to Griffith University Nathan Campus

This route currently operates hourly in the peak periods between Browns Plains and Griffith University Nathan campus and will be removed due to the low frequency and demand for this service. When travelling from Browns Plains, Beaudesert Road and Mains Road corridors, you will have alternative high-frequency BUZ services and can transfer to Route 135 – Parkinson to Griffith University station on Mains Road at Altandi station, to connect to Griffith University Nathan campus. This will simplify the network structure along the Mains Road and Beaudesert Road corridors while still providing you with access to alternative, high-frequency services.

Route P151 – Calamvale to City

This service currently operates between Calamvale and the city during peak periods with only three trips in each direction. Most patronage on this route comes from the Mains Road corridor, where there are many alternative high-frequency services, which you can use to complete your journey.

When travelling from the Gowan Road corridor to Mains Road, you can use Route 115 - Calamvale to Griffith University station and transfer to high-frequency services in Sunnybank Hills. Route 153 – Drewvale to City will also provide a direct peak city connection for Gowan Road. This will simplify the network structure along the Mains Road corridor and reduce route duplication to allow resources to be used across other parts of the network that need improving.

New all-day services will be introduced in some streets that currently only have a peak period service.

This means more travel options and increased access to destinations across the network including connections to the high-frequency metro corridor.

Improved connections

We are evolving our network to improve suburban connections to key destinations for education, healthcare, leisure and employment.

This will include new direct access to shopping centres, universities, retirement villages and high-frequency metro and busway services.


Consultation outcomes

Following consultation, further planning activities occurred and we will now provide a faster and more direct connection from Mt Gravatt, Wishart, Mansfield and Wellers Hill to PA Hospital and The University of Queensland.

Based on feedback to retain the Inala loop, Route 122 will no longer be extended to Richlands rail station. For more information refer to page 76.

New direct connections

- Route 26 will provide direct peak connections from the South East Busway to RBWH station via Woolloongabba, Kangaroo Point and Fortitude Valley.
- Route 115 will provide Acacia Ridge with direct access to Griffith University Nathan campus and connections to high-frequency metro and busway services at Griffith University station.
- Route 161 will provide Klumpp Road park 'n' ride (Upper Mt Gravatt) and Dawson Road, Upper Mt Gravatt with new direct all-day connections to the metro and busway network at Griffith University station.
- Route 172 will provide Greenslopes Hospital with new direct connection from Greenslopes Hospital to high-frequency metro and busway services at Greenslopes station and Buranda busway station.
- Route 179 will provide Wishart, Mt Gravatt and Holland Park with new direct access to The University of Queensland.
- Route 182 will provide Mansfield and Wishart with new direct access to Mt Gravatt Plaza.
- Route 192 will provide Fairfield and Yeerongpilly with new direct access to The University of Queensland.
- Route 202 and Route 205 will provide Chatsworth Road with new direct all-day connections to high-frequency metro and busway services at Buranda busway station.





Enhanced suburban connections

Enhanced suburban connections

Brisbane's New Bus Network includes enhancements to existing connections in the network, making it easier for you to access key destinations, as outlined below.

- Routes 115, 125, 135 and 155 will provide improved connections from Griffith University Nathan campus to three nearby public transport interchange locations, including:
 - Griffith University station (connecting to high-frequency metro and busway services).
 - Altandi rail station (connecting to the Beenleigh and Gold Coast Lines).
 - Salisbury rail station (connecting to the Beenleigh Line).
- Route 155 will provide connections between:
 - Eight Mile Plains (Warrigal Road and Padstow Road) to Sunnybank.
 - Eight Mile Plains (Underwood Road and Gaskell Street) to high-frequency metro and busway services at both
 Eight Mile Plains and Griffith University station.
- Route 161 will provide increased peak services between Wishart Outlook and Westfield Mt Gravatt.
- Route 177 will provide improved all-day connection to Griffith University station from Carindale.
- **Route 182** will provide increased daytime frequency and connections in parts of Wishart and Mansfield to Westfield Mt Gravatt and Upper Mt Gravatt station, providing connections to high-frequency metro and busway services.
- Route 181 will provide:
 - more peak service options for customers in Mansfield and Mt Gravatt East (Greenmeadow Road and Creek Road).
 - increased peak services along Greendale Way, providing more travel options for Carindale Heights.
- Route P201 will provide improved peak hour connections to the city from Camp Hill (Martha Street and Newman Avenue).

Transforming and simplifying the inner city network

Brisbane's inner busway is made up of four stations – Roma Street station, City Hall / King George Square station, Queen Street bus station and Cultural Centre station.

Currently, most high-frequency routes stop at Cultural Centre station and many services travel via the South East Busway, causing bottlenecks in our inner city which impacts on the reliability of your journey. A number of other routes also service stops at street level, with the majority of these in the central part of the CBD.

Without change, the current inner city network will remain congested, service reliability will continue to be impacted and we will be unable to accommodate any future growth in services.

Improving our inner city network

Under our new network, the CBD network has been simplified to provide customers with more travel options and better service reliability.

This means changes to where some buses enter, travel and stop within the inner city.

The new network aims to improve connections, service newly developed areas and create more consistent stopping patterns, helping customers better navigate the city.

High-frequency services have been redistributed between the four inner busway stations, contributing to a reduction of buses over Victoria Bridge by up to 30%. This will free up the congested Cultural Centre station while still maintaining convenient transfer opportunities between high-frequency services at all inner busway stations. Where a transfer is required, Council is planning to make this as seamless and simple for customers as possible.

Under the new network, most peak services will have similar morning and afternoon bus stop locations, meaning more of us can expect to get off our morning bus nearby to where we'll catch it later that afternoon.

In the afternoon peak period, many of the peak service stops will be centrally located to key pedestrian thoroughfares, providing you with more convenient options.

Consultation outcomes

During consultation, minimal feedback was received on most inner city changes however, there was some mixed feedback regarding changes to the inner city alignments for Route 330, Route 345 and Route 385. Some of you were supportive of these routes now servicing Queen Street bus station.

Others raised concerns about the transfer required for onward travel to and from Cultural Centre station. Customers using these services will be able to undertake a same-platform transfer to a high-frequency service to continue their journey.

Northside journeys

Most north and north-eastern services that currently complete their journey at the Cultural Centre station will complete their journey in the CBD. This includes routes 301, 306, 322, 330, 345 and 385.

For northside customers wishing to continue to the Cultural Centre station, same-platform transfers can be undertaken at:

- Roma Street station (M1, M2, high frequency BUZ services)
- Queen Street bus station (high frequency BUZ services).

For north-eastern customers wishing to continue to the Cultural Centre station, you can either transfer on Adelaide Street or walk to City Hall / King George Square station to access a high-frequency metro service to the Cultural Centre station.

South and south-eastern journeys

Some southern and eastern services will travel to Fortitude Valley via the Captain Cook Bridge and Mary Street, rather than the inner busway. This includes routes 125, 175, 185 and 204

For southside customers on these routes wishing to continue to Cultural Centre station, a same-platform transfer may be required at Woolloongabba station.

In addition, some southern and eastern peak services that currently travel to Fortitude Valley, will no longer do so.


To access Fortitude Valley you can transfer to the new highfrequency peak service, Route 26 - Griffith University station to RBWH station on the South East Busway.

How to use this section of the guide

This section includes individual maps and details for routes that will change when the new network is implemented, alongside a summary of community feedback and Council's response to this feedback.

When reviewing this information, please note:

- Further information on route timetables, and new bus stops will be communicated as part of the implementation of the new bus network.
- Any referenced hours of operation and frequency, including definition of peak times, are a guide only and subject to refinement.
- Brisbane's New Bus Network did not include a review of Translink Nightlink services.
- School services (district services) will be reviewed in partnership with Translink prior to and following the implementation of the new network.

Common feedback themes

We received common feedback from the community on a number of routes in the network. Where applied, this feedback has been noted against routes and our response has been included below.

Feedback themes	Our response
Transfers between services and two-seat journeys to reach key destinations	With our city growing, we need to evolve our network to provide you with more on-time services, travel options and connected destinations. This means some journeys will require a transfer, which in most cases will be a same-platform or same-stop transfer. Council has carefully planned these changes using detailed customer travel pattern data to inform our approach to transfers.
School services and student travel	We regularly review school services and this will continue in partnership with Translink in the lead up to the implementation of Brisbane's New Bus Network. Following the implementation of the new network, Council will undertake further review and analysis of all school routes and travel patterns across Brisbane.
Requests for improved frequency or hours of operation and service overcrowding	Council operates a range of service types, including many high-frequency services as outlined on the following pages. The hours of operation and frequency of services is designed in consideration of available funding, customer demand and broader network needs. Changes to frequency, hours of operation or to address overcrowding of services would require further coordination with Translink. Any changes to bus services requires the approval of Translink before implementation.
Reliability of services and requests for improved timetables	Timetables will be reviewed as a part of the implementation of Brisbane's New Bus Network. The feedback regarding reliability and on-time performance of services will be assessed further when route timetables are developed.

Glossary of network terms

Route descriptions

- Full-time all stops a route that runs throughout the day and stops at all bus stops on its route path.
- Full-time limited stops a route that runs throughout the day but only stops at some bus stops on its route path. This type of service is sometimes referred to as an express service.
- Peak service a route that operates in the busiest period of the morning or afternoon and generally only stops at some bus stops on its route path. This type of service typically travels to/from the city and is sometimes referred to as a Rocket service.
- BUZ these are no timetable needed, high-frequency bus services connecting the suburbs to the city.
- CityGlider these are no timetable needed, high frequency bus services that travel through the inner city to key destinations.

- Cross-town a route that runs between suburbs, and doesn't travel via the city.
- Busway service a route that travels exclusively on the busways.

Frequency – a general guide as to how often the service operates.

Hours of operation – a general guide as to when the service operates. AM peak and PM peak are typically between 7-9am and 3-7pm.


Key destinations – places such as shopping centres, libraries and medical facilities that are serviced.

Key interchanges – places that offer access to other public transport services for onward journeys.

Route 26 – Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to RBWH station via Woolloongabba and Fortitude Valley

Consultation outcomes		
Summary of feedback	Two route options were proposed for the new route alignment connecting the Story Bridge and RBWH station. You shared with us a preference for Option A, travelling through Fortitude Valley to connect the Story Bridge and RBWH station. You also shared with us a desire to: • realign this route in Kangaroo Point and extend it further south to Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) • operate this route as an all-day service including off-peak, weekends and at night, rather than just at peak periods.	
Response to feedback	Route 26 will operate via Fortitude Valley when travelling between the Story Bridge and RBWH station. Based on your feedback, Route 26 has been extended to terminate at Upper Mt Gravatt station (Garden City) to improve connectivity to services in the south and improve accessibility to Garden City Shopping Centre. Following community consultation, an assessment of the proposed route alignment through Kangaroo Point and Fortitude Valley to RBWH station was undertaken. Route 26 will operate on a revised alignment via Fortitude Valley, that is impacted less by RNA event road closures. The alignment will also provide more direct cross-town journeys than the proposed alignment through Fortitude Valley, improve connectivity to rail services at Fortitude Valley station and allow a same-platform connection when interchanging between other northside services at RBWH station.
