

## Notes:

Parking is available at three locations marked on the map. Parking at the Edward Street/Alice Street entrance is angle parking and gives greatest ease of access to the Gardens and Riverwalk.

All pathways are paved except those designated as boardwalks.

Hill's Avenue is a newly constructed fully accessible wooden boardwalk providing a link between the Bunya Walk and the Albert Street entrance and to the All Abilities Playground.

The small restored rotunda off the Bunya Walk has an accessible path and boardwalks which extend into the rainforest area.

# Accessible adult change facilities

There are two accessible adult change facilities, with ceiling hoists and adult change tables, in the Brisbane central business district (CBD).

1. Brisbane City Hall (ask at Concierge, main entrance). 2. City Botanic Gardens (MLAK\* key required).

### Brisbane City Council libraries

Council libraries are accessible to people with disabilities and are great places to relax, work, read or study.

Libraries offer a large range of accessible materials in formats including large-print books, audio books and downloadable content accessible via the online library catalogue, eLibCat.

Selected libraries also offer:

- facilities for wheelchair access and wheelchair recharge
- meeting rooms with hearing loops
- internet computers with an interface that includes an on-screen keyboard, narrator and magnifier

### City Hall Mobility Centre

The mobility centre at City Hall loans mobility devices for use within Brisbane's CBD, South Bank Parklands and the South Bank cultural precinct.

Wheelchairs, wheeled walkers and single prams can be borrowed for up to a whole day, depending on availability.

The centre is located on the ground floor of Brisbane City Hall and is open:

- Monday to Friday, 8am-5pm
- Saturday and Sunday, 9am-5pm.
