We've invested more than 80% of our budget in the suburbs this financial year to ensure Brisbane remains the best place to live, work and relax.

We're delivering vital projects and initiatives for Brisbane residents including:

- ◆ launching the Safer School Precincts program in Kedron, Mansfield and Wynnum Manly
- ◆ rolling out more than 160,000 new green bins
- ◆ launching Brisbane Food Trucks and Coffee Carts in Parks, creating more to see and do in our parks, sports grounds and foreshores
- ◆ continuing road improvements, including Beams Road
- ◆ upgrading parks, including Rocks Riverside Park
- ◆ developing concept plans for Carindale Recreation Reserve and Dorrington Park, Ashgrove
- ◆ releasing concept plans for the Pallara and Ellen Grove district sports parks
- ◆ developing plans for suburban precincts in Mt Gravatt Centre, Stones Corner and Wynnum Centre.

Working together for a safer Brisbane

Brisbane has the best lifestyle in Australia and we're determined to keep it that way.

Our Safer Suburbs Grants have provided \$981,318 to boost security for community-leased facilities, since they were introduced in 2024.

We regularly work with the Queensland Police Service (QPS) and Crime Stoppers QLD to make sure our community stays safe.

We've worked closely with QPS, councillors and the community to introduce 26 mobile and fixed CCTV cameras across Brisbane, expanding the network to around 4,500 cameras in the last financial year.

We're also installing new and improved lighting in targeted locations and continuing our 18-year partnership to support Crime Stoppers' work in our community.

Transforming Oxley Creek corridor

We're creating more to see and do in the suburbs by working with Brisbane Sustainability Agency to bring the Oxley Creek Transformation Master Plan to life.

Works will soon be underway on the first stage of Graceville Riverside Parklands, which includes upgrades to the existing playground, new picnic facilities, an event-ready community lawn and native landscaping and revegetation.

Further revegetation is progressing along the Oxley Creek corridor as part of the Archerfield Wetlands Northern Ponds Habitat Transformation Project.

WOMEN'S BUS DRIVER CAREER DAYS

NEW MT COOT-THA BIKE TRAIL

Mountain bikers can now enjoy the new 1.8 km Crebra Climb trail in Mt Coot-tha. Built over 6 months by 108 volunteers from the Mt Coot-tha Trail Care team, the trail is an important link in the Gap Creek Reserve network. Our bike trails are another reason why Brisbane is one of the best places in the world to live, work and relax.

ST PAULS TERRACE BLACK SPOT

We're improving safety on St Pauls Terrace, Fortitude Valley, through the Australian Government's Black Spots Program. Works include new traffic signals with pedestrian crossings at Quarry Street, changing Warren Street to left-in only from St Pauls Terrace and adding a right turn arrow into the traffic lights at Gotha Street.

Small donations make a big difference

You can now drop off donations for our Homeless Connect event at Council ward offices and libraries.

The free, one-day event brings together essential services in one place for people experiencing homelessness or doing it tough.

Our next event will be held on Wednesday 13 May at the Brisbane Showgrounds, Bowen Hills, with the help of dedicated volunteers.

Boosting housing supply in Brisbane

Brisbane is one of Australia's fastest-growing capital cities and we're helping deliver new homes sooner, waiving more than \$2.7 million in infrastructure charges for new community housing developments.

The waivers form part of our *Housing Supply Action Plan*, which accelerates building new homes by reducing charges, streamlining assessments and advocating for planning reform.

The savings have helped the Brisbane Housing Corporation (BHC) deliver 2 new affordable housing projects this year - a 92-apartment development in Chermside and an 82-unit development in Stones Corner.

We've also donated land to BHC for a pilot project to deliver 3 affordable townhouses in Chermside.

It's all about striking a balance to encourage more homes in the right places while protecting Brisbane's low-density suburbs and our incredible lifestyle.





It's game on for free shuttle services

Nothing screams Brisbane pride quite like being among the action and cheering on the Broncos and Lions at their home grounds.

We're making it even easier and more affordable to see our Brisbane NRL and AFL heroes by offering free shuttle bus services to Suncorp Stadium and The Gabba on game days for ticket holders and stadium members.

The shuttles depart from Chermside, Carindale, Eight Mile Plains, The Gap (for Suncorp games only) and Brisbane CBD approximately 2 hours before kick-off. Return shuttles to these locations then operate for one hour after the game ends.

Ticket holders and stadium members can also travel for free on our regular Council bus and metro services 4 hours before and after each game, so you can leave the car at home.

All you need to do is show your pre-purchased event ticket when boarding the vehicle and, of course, don't forget to wear maroon!

Rebates to help you compost at home

We're making it more affordable to get started on composting and food waste recycling at home with our Compost Rebate Program.

You can apply for up to \$100 for the purchase of eligible composting or worm farm equipment.

You can also claim up to \$200 for eligible food waste recycling equipment like food waste dehydrators and in-sink food disposal systems.

Composting is a small change with a big impact.

It diverts waste from landfill and creates a nutrient-dense, natural fertiliser that your gardens will love.

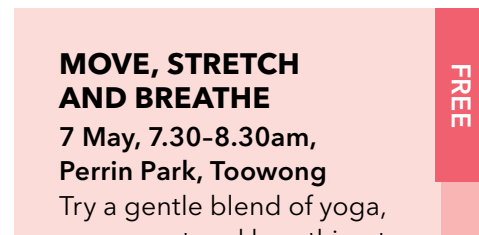

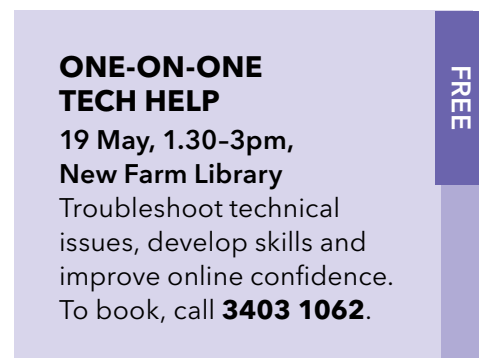

Keeping a local icon strong

Around 32,000 people cross between Indooroopilly and Chelmer on the Walter Taylor Bridge every day.

We're doing important renewal works to keep this much-loved local landmark safe and looking its best.

We've begun a multi-year project to inspect and refresh the bridge's tower facades. Initial inspections are underway and will help us plan staged renewal works into the future.

Meanwhile, from early May, we'll start replacing several steel nodes that connect the bridge's cables to its truss to keep the bridge safe and reliable.

To carry out this work safely, the bridge will be closed to vehicles on selected weekends in May and June.

Footpath access will be closed from mid-April, with pedestrian and cyclist detours in place.
