Brisbane's balanced Budget

Brisbane residents will continue to pay less and get more in our cost-of-living Budget.

We're investing more than 90% of our \$3.9 billion budget in our suburbs through our suburbs-first guarantee, delivering better parks and facilities for everyone to enjoy.

Residents will pay hundreds of dollars less per year on average for minimum general rates than other South East Queensland councils and we're increasing the pensioner rates rebate by \$52 to \$1,350 per year.

We're investing in better roads and core services that help shape our reputation as Australia's lifestyle capital, including a record \$110 million on road resurfacing as part of Operation Smooth.

We're also bringing back our popular \$2 Summer Dips and free off-peak travel for seniors on CityCats and buses.

We're committed to investing in what matters most to Brisbane and delivering a balanced Budget that provides real value for residents.

Move more, live well

Our new Move Well Brisbane program will make it even easier to stay active, learn new skills and enjoy our outstanding lifestyle.

We're scaling up the number of our free and affordable wellness sessions from 9,000 to 20,000 over the next 2 years with more locations around Brisbane and more dawn, dusk and weekend options available.

We'll also be partnering with more local businesses and organisations including Nutrition Australia to offer new experiences like preparing nutritious, tasty and budget-conscious meals.

The Move Well Brisbane program is the biggest boost to free and affordable activities in Brisbane's history and will launch later this year.

Even more reasons to love our lifestyle

Brisbane has the best lifestyle in Australia and we're committed to keeping it that way by investing in our parks and playgrounds and creating more to see and do in the suburbs.

We're upgrading and building new parks in all corners of the city.

We're also planning and delivering destination sports parks for everyone to enjoy with a range of facilities at Pallara, Ellen Grove and Rochedale.

We'll be releasing the anticipated Kedron Brook Vision and Master Plan to revitalise and rejuvenate the catchment and finalising the design for The Greenway – a green spine connecting the Brisbane River at Oxley and Archerfield Wetlands.



Future-proofing the iconic Story Bridge

For 86 years, the Story Bridge has been both a critical transport connection for Queenslanders and a much-loved icon of Brisbane.

It was built to last 100 years and we're progressing a business case that will provide a blueprint to ensure it's around for another century and more.

In 2026-27, we'll continue working on the bridge and finalise the business case for the Story Bridge Renewal Project, which will guide the renewal works for the next 20 years.

More than \$120 million has been invested over the past 2 decades to maintain and renew the bridge.

The Story Bridge is one of Queensland's most important transport and heritage assets, and that's why it's important for us to plan its long-term future to keep Brisbane moving today, tomorrow and into the future.



Record investment in Operation Smooth

We're investing more than ever in road resurfacing this financial year to get you home sooner and safer.

Our teams are busy year-round maintaining our 5,800-kilometre road network and now we're ramping up work for an even bigger year of road resurfacing.

Approximately 340,000 tonnes of asphalt will go towards resurfacing 190 locations over the coming year, including:

- ◆ Elizabeth Street, Brisbane City
- ◆ Hamilton Road, Chermside/ Wavell Heights
- ◆ Hawken Drive, St Lucia
- ◆ Ipswich Road, Annerley
- ◆ Logan Road, Upper Mount Gravatt
- ◆ Lutwyche Road, Lutwyche/ Windsor
- ◆ Mains Road, Sunnybank.

We're keeping Brisbane moving and building better roads for today and the future.

Safer roads and footpaths

Brisbane is one of Australia's fastest-growing cities which is why we're investing even more in important infrastructure to get you home sooner and safer.

We're upgrading more intersections across the city and suburbs to help keep Brisbane moving.

We're delivering more Black Spot projects, signalling intersections, creating new footpaths and upgrading existing ones around Brisbane.

Improving safety in Brisbane's growing school precincts will continue in 2026-27 with Safer School Precincts projects progressing in Kedron, Mansfield, Wynnum and Indooroopilly.

NEW BIKEWAY PLANS OUT NOW

The Shafston Avenue Bikeway in Kangaroo Point is taking shape, with preliminary designs now complete. The 1.2-kilometre section between Deakin Street and Mowbray Park will help keep Brisbane moving by improving the connection between the eastern suburbs and the CBD via the Kangaroo Point Bridge. Brisbane Metro keeps millions moving

Brisbane Metro has recorded more than 11 million passenger trips since services first began in 2025.

More residents are getting on board the frequent, turn-up-and-go services for everyday travel to get to the people, places and activities they love.

And it's not stopping there. Planning is underway to expand Brisbane Metro to more parts of the city, with future routes being explored for the north, east, south and Brisbane Airport.

Supporting those who need it most

We're helping Emmanuel City Mission to provide practical support and safe places for people experiencing homelessness and hardships by contributing \$750,000 over the next 3 years.

This builds on an initial \$500,000 contribution in last year's budget that helped deliver female bathroom and sleeping facilities, allowing the mission's Night Sanctuary to welcome both men and women for the first time.

Since opening in November last year, the Night Sanctuary has provided more than 600 overnight stays, offering a warm meal, a safe place to sleep and support services that have helped people to find a way out of homelessness.

New kerbside collection calendar is out now

Make the most of kerbside collection when it rolls around to your neighbourhood.

- ◆ Place your items for collection on the kerbside in the front of your property by 6am on the first day of the collection period.
- ◆ Keep piles less than 2 cubic metres or the size of a small box-trailer load.
- ◆ If you have more material than 2 cubic metres, you can dispose of it at our resource recovery centres.
- ◆ Check out the list of acceptable and unacceptable items on our website.
- ◆ Put recyclable items like cardboard boxes in your yellow bin throughout the year.

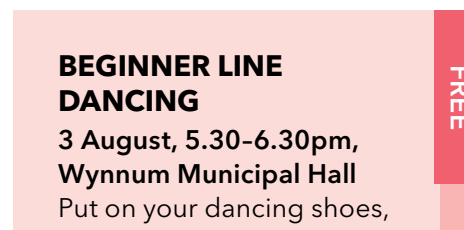

Funding boost to community grants

Brisbane's grassroots clubs are scoring big wins in our 2026-27 Budget, with a major boost to the Lord Mayor's Better Suburbs Grants.

An additional \$900,000 will expand the Community Facility category, with grants of up to \$200,000 available to help clubs design and deliver upgraded spaces for community-leased facilities.

The Community Support category will also rise from \$10,000 to \$15,000, helping groups fund essential maintenance, improve sustainability and purchase new equipment. Search 'community grants' on our website.
