Brisbane leads the way in tech safety

Technology can be amazing - until it isn't. Hidden tracking, surveillance and digital interference can turn everyday devices into tools of abuse, often hard to detect without expert help.

Brisbane is now home to the Technology Abuse Detection and Assessment Hub, a national first, created by the Naturalena Foundation.

With support from a recent Lord Mayor's Charitable Trust grant, the hub has provided 30 women with free tech assessments this year, helping restore safety, privacy and peace of mind.

Good news for Story Bridge

Works to replace the eastern footpath on Brisbane's iconic Story Bridge are on track to be wrapped up in the coming weeks, following the reopening of the western (city-side) footpath last month.

Works have forged on ahead of schedule, with crews using a purpose-built rolling rig to lay the new custom-made decking over the ageing footpaths. The almost \$7 million investment to install the new decking is in addition to the nearly \$80 million invested in the Story Bridge since 2019.

The new footpaths are part of our long-term restoration plan to keep the 85-year-old bridge in great condition for generations to come.



Beams Road upgrades well on track

We're making progress on the next stage of the Beams Road upgrade to get you where you need to be sooner and safer.

Over the past 6 months, we've been improving underground drainage and electrical utilities, and now we're reducing bottlenecks by widening the Cabbage Tree Creek bridge to 4 lanes.

We're also building a shared underpass under Beams Road, providing a safe and separate space for people walking and riding along the Cabbage Tree Creek Bikeway.

Beams Road is a vital link for northside residents, and part of our work to improve safety, reduce congestion and keep Brisbane moving.

Keeping Brisbane moving

It's been 'all systems go' in 2025 with the launch of the Brisbane Metro M1 and M2 routes, the introduction of Brisbane's New Bus Network and the opening of the Adelaide Street tunnel.

Since Brisbane Metro services started, more than 4 million trips have been taken.

It has been a game changer, moving more people, more often, reducing bus congestion in the CBD and creating reliable journeys across the bus network.

Brisbane's New Bus Network launched on 30 June, adding 160,000 bus trips to the network annually.

Keep braille trails clear to help others

Have you seen the pavers with raised dots and dashes on footpaths of busy areas like Queen Street Mall?

They're part of our braille trails, which help people with visual impairment to move around the city safely and easily using a cane.

The braille trails run from Reddacliff Place, down Queen Street Mall and on to Anzac Square.

Help keep our braille trails clear for people using it to navigate by:

- not walking on the braille trails
- not placing bags or other items on the braille trails
- not standing on the braille trails.

By keeping our braille trails clear, we can all help make Brisbane's lifestyle even better for everyone.
