KangaCat joins our CityDogs, Bluey and Bingo, as iconic members of our CityCat and ferry services, which carried a record 6.8 million passengers in the last financial year.

A good story needs a sequel

For generations, the Story Bridge has been the backdrop for some of our city's most memorable moments.

1930s

The Great Depression: The bridge was conceived and built by the Queensland Government to create jobs for Queenslanders.

1940

World War II: Opening less than a year after Australia entered WWII, the Story Bridge became a vital transport route for Australian and American forces.

1954

Queen Elizabeth II's first visit to Brisbane: The Story Bridge was lit up in honour of the monarch's arrival.

1974

Brisbane floods: During the devastating floods, the bridge stood strong, serving as a symbol of Brisbane's resilience.

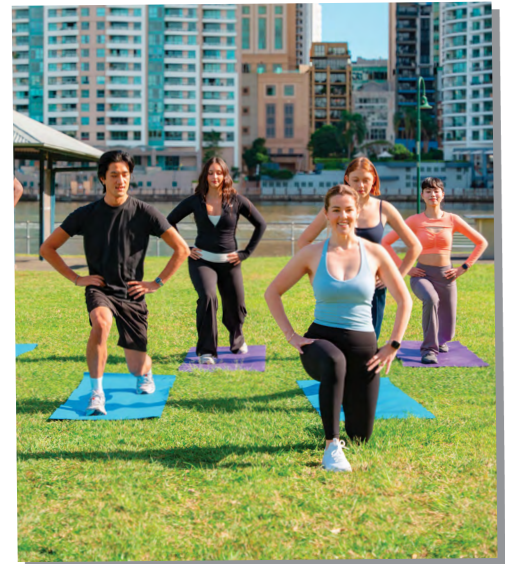
1988

World Expo '88: As we welcomed millions of visitors, the Story Bridge formed part of the city's internationally recognised skyline.

1998

Riverfire: Since the birth of Riverfire, the bridge has played a starring role in this annual celebration of our city.

ROAD UPGRADE ON THE WAY

Work will start soon on upgrades to the Archerfield Road, Azalea Street and Pine Road intersection in Inala. The improvements include new traffic lights, turning lanes, safer crossings and better walking and cycling links, helping make everyday trips safer and easier for everyone travelling through the area.



Learn, explore and be prepared

Get ready for a fun and informative day out at the Brisbane Emergency Services Expo from 9am to 2pm on Saturday 10 October, where you can meet the people who help keep our city safe.

The free community event at Playground One, 7th Brigade Park, Chermside, near the corner of Newman Road and Delaware Street, brings together emergency service agencies, interactive displays and vehicle demonstrations. It also features family-friendly activities including Paw Patrol, face painting and a jumping castle.

More ways to call Brisbane home

More housing choices are coming to Brisbane, making it easier for more people to find a home that suits their needs close to shops, services and public transport.

From mid-September, changes to *Brisbane City Plan 2014* will support more duplexes, row houses and low-rise apartments in the Low-medium density residential zone.

The changes will make it easier to build new homes on smaller lots and simplify the approval process. There will also be more opportunities to build more homes closer to suburban shopping centres.

The reforms are expected to support around 6,000 additional homes by 2032 while maintaining Brisbane's suburban character. For more information, visit our website and search 'More Homes, Sooner'.



New cameras to protect our suburbs

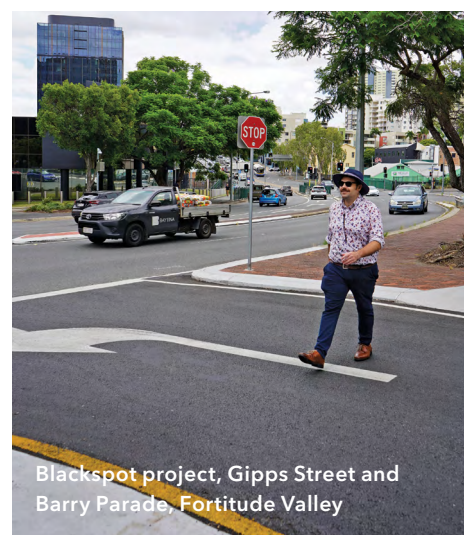
Brisbane has the best lifestyle in Australia, and we're determined to keep it that way by boosting safety in Brisbane's local business precincts.

We're installing new CCTV cameras this financial year, adding them to our CitySafe network in Milton, Spring Hill, New Farm, Bowen Hills, Woolloongabba, the CBD, Fortitude Valley and Wynnum.

The expanded coverage, part of the Secure Communities Partnerships Program with the Queensland Government, will help deter crime, reduce vandalism and support police investigations.

The cameras join our network of more than 4,700 CCTV cameras across Brisbane.

Keeping Brisbane moving

Getting around Brisbane will soon be even easier with our upcoming intersection upgrades.

New traffic lights, dedicated turning lanes and improved crossings will help reduce congestion and improve safety for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians.

Intersection projects currently under construction include:

- ◆ Cavendish Road, Holdsworth Street and Kitchener Street, Coorparoo
- ◆ Esher Street and Toohey Road, Tarragindi.

We're also upgrading road signals at Archerfield Road, Azalea Street and Pine Road in Inala, with work expected to start later this year, and continuing to investigate upgrade opportunities across Brisbane.

Thank you for your patience during construction as we continue investing in safer, more connected roads for Brisbane's suburbs and communities.

Green bin know-how for a cleaner Brisbane

Spring is the perfect time to tidy the garden ahead of storm season.

Use your green bin to recycle loose garden waste into mulch and compost, keeping it out of landfill.

Yes, put these in your green bin	No, keep these out
◆ Grass clippings ◆ Palm fronds ◆ Garden cuttings and prunings ◆ Weeds, flowers and small plants ◆ Leaves and loose bark ◆ Small branches and bamboo plants	◆ Food scraps ◆ Animal waste ◆ Plastic bags or any bagged waste ◆ Loose dirt, soil, rocks or fill ◆ Treated timber, large branches or stumps ◆ General waste or recycling

Make sure to cut your branches and palm fronds so they can fit in the bin with the lid closed.
