City Plan online user guide - making a submission

Brisbane City Council publishes and maintains *Brisbane City Plan 2014* (City Plan), the local planning scheme used to guide land use, development and infrastructure coordination across the local government area. City Plan online is the digital representation of the planning scheme. Proposed amendments for public consultation are accessible via City Plan online.


Viewing proposed amendments

- Visit City Plan online.
- Select a proposed amendment from the 'News and updates' panel.
- Proposed amendments will open in the planning scheme viewer. The left navigation panel will be filtered to show only City Plan parts affected by the selected proposed amendment.
- Click 'Show Amendment changes' at the top of page to highlight all content proposed to be changed by the amendment.
- Changes are described in boxes with blue-dashed outlines.

Submissions

Via <u>City Plan online</u>, anyone can make a submission on a proposed amendment as a guest or registered user during the open public consultation period.

Registered users can:

- create and save draft submissions to submit before consultation closes
- view their previous submissions.

Note: During registration, you will be asked to provide contact details. Guest users (unregistered) must also provide contact details as a requirement of making a formal submission.


Making a submission and registering as a user

- 1. Read the proposed amendment.
- **2.** Select 'Make a Submission' from the top left menu on the amendment page or 'Submissions' from the home screen to access the Submissions Portal.
- **3.** You are then able to continue as a guest or login or sign up as a registered user following the steps below:
 - Select 'login' from the home screen to enter the login page.
 - Register with a Google or Facebook account or click 'Sign up now' to use email.
 - Follow the prompts.
- **4.** Select a submission option:
 - Make a general submission select topics
 - Make a submission on the plan content all proposed changes
 - Both options

Note: If the amendment allows both options, this choice is presented after login.









Make a general submission

A 'submission point' refers to your response to a change in the proposed amendment. Each submission point includes a comment space and an option to upload attachments that support your comments.

After saving your first submission point, select **'+ New submission point'** to respond to other items. When finished, click **'Submit'** at the bottom of the page.







Make a submission on the plan content

Select the '+ New submission point' button on the page or via the left menu.



Select content for your comments from boxes with blue-dashed outlines and complete the prompted steps in a pop-up box that shows:


- a copy of the selected content
- options to support, support in part or oppose the change
- · comment field.

Note, use the 'Add provision text' button to copy amendment text into the comment field for editing.

Select 'Save new point' when you have finished each submission point. If required, your completed submission points can be reviewed and edited from a summary page.

When finished, click 'Submit'.





Confirmation

Council will send submitters a confirmation email after receiving and processing their submission. Note, these emails are <u>not automated</u>, so confirmation of receipt is not immediate.
