#### 1.0 Introduction

Brisbane City Council (Council) proposed the citywide planning scheme policy (PSP) amendments for the Infrastructure design planning scheme policy (IDPSP) and the Transport, access, parking and servicing planning scheme policy (TAPSPSP) to ensure *Brisbane City Plan* 2014 (City Plan) remains effective and up to date. Statutory public consultation on amending City Plan was undertaken between 3 August and 14 September 2023.

### 2.0 Engagement activities

## 3.0 PSP amendments submissions

Council received one submission on the PSP amendments. Information about the submission and how Council has considered and responded is provided in the table below.

#### 3.1 Table 1 – General

Submission reference	Submission summary	Response	Change required
189.1	Objection to mandating car parking spaces within the TAPSPSP, as it causes an oversupply of parking, increased traffic and strains on-street parking	The TAPSPSP identifies parking rates applicable to specific land uses to ensure a suitable supply of parking is provided as part of new development. However, a new or changed car parking policy is not in scope of the proposed "Citywide amendments – Planning scheme policy amendments – Infrastructure design planning scheme policy and Transport, access, parking and servicing planning scheme policy".  The proposed amendments to the TAPSPSP support the introduction of a new park type – Urban Neighbourhood Park, as part of the draft Local government infrastructure plan amendment 1B. This new park type will not require additional car parking spaces, similar to the existing urban common park classification.  Note: the TAPSPSP identifies maximum and minimum parking rates for new development, including those that apply to the City core and City frame areas (identified in Figure a of the Transport, access, parking and servicing code in City Plan section 9.4.11). Council amended City Plan on 14 March 2025 to extend the areas to which City core and City frame car parking rates would apply.	No change
