About the project

We're making the busy Esher Street and Toohey Road intersection in Tarragindi safer and easier to navigate, with works commencing soon.

This intersection experiences heavy traffic during peak times and drivers often take risks to get through.

That's why we're upgrading it with new traffic lights and signalised pedestrian crossings to better manage movements and improve safety for everyone.

We're also widening the road and adding dedicated turning lanes to ease congestion. Plus, a new footpath connection will make it easier and safer to get around.

The detailed design is now complete and construction is set to kick off in early 2026.


