Pallara District Sports Park



We're getting underway with early works for the new Pallara District Sports Park in Pallara.

This is an exciting first step ahead of main construction works later this year to deliver a vibrant new sports and recreation park for the community to enjoy, now and into the future.

Project overview

We are delivering a new district-level sports park in Pallara to support a growing community with quality places to play, train and connect.

Following community engagement in 2023-2024, we incorporated your feedback alongside technical investigations to shape the final concept plan released in late 2025.

This project is a long-term investment in local liveability, creating a place where residents can come together to play sport, be active and enjoy open green space close to home.

What's involved?

We're delivering a mix of community sport and recreation features, including:

- 2 **outdoor sports fields**.
- A **clubhouse with public amenities**, creating a central hub for players, families and visitors.
- **On-site parking** and dedicated **bus drop off** to make access simple.
- **Sports lighting and irrigation** to support evening use and quality playing surfaces.
- Welcome **open green spaces** and a **future playground** area and picnic facilities site.

Early works

From **late March 2026**, we expect to start works to build new kerb and channel and footpath on Van Dieren Road, plant new street trees, and install a new stormwater outlet pipe in J.M Sullivan Park.

This work will help set the park up for main construction works on the new sports park in late 2026.

Another update, including timing, what to expect and any temporary changes nearby, will be provided before early works begin.
