Annerley Road plays an important role connecting you to work, school, local destinations and beyond. The road links 4 suburbs and is a key travel corridor for the surrounding community.

Council recognises the important role this corridor is already playing in moving residents and visitors through the area and we're investigating opportunities to support active travel along the corridor to help get you where you want to be sooner and safer.

We are inviting you to share your travel experiences on Annerley Road between Peter Doherty Street, Dutton Park and Ipswich Road, Annerley to inform potential future active travel options.

Improved active transport facilities along this route would benefit travellers in all transport modes by giving every member of the community the option to safely, sustainably and efficiently travel in the transport mode that best suits them.

This is part of a grant-funded process to investigate potential concept options to improve the active transport connections for residents, visitors and commuters.


Investigations area

We are investigating potential active transport improvements along Annerley Road between Peter Doherty Street, Dutton Park and Ipswich Road, Annerley.

This section of Annerley Road is part primary cycle route and part secondary route, making it a key connection in Brisbane's cycle network.

We know this route is important to our city and we are exploring potential ways to make this section of Annerley Road safer for all users with a high-quality active transport connection to help get you where you need to go.
