Beeston Street at Macquarie Street, Teneriffe Local Access Network Improvements

Project introduction

Project overview

We're pleased to announce plans to improve safety and accessibility on Beeston Street at Macquarie Street in Teneriffe.

What does this project involve?

This project will include:

- installing a pedestrian refuge island on Beeston Street at Macquarie Street
- kerb build outs and upgrading kerb ramps on both sides of Beeston Street, and the western side of the existing pedestrian refuge crossing on Macquarie Street
- minor footpath improvements
- painting associated line marking, including yellow 'No Stopping' lines where on-street parking will not be permitted.

Bus stop and loading zone changes

Bus stop 14 (Macquarie Street at Mercantile Place) is also required to be relocated approximately 12 metres north on Macquarie Street to ensure safe sightlines for all road users at the intersection of Beeston and Macquarie Streets.

This relocation means the loading zone space adjoining the bus stop will be shortened and will accommodate one vehicle. To ensure a balanced distribution of loading zone parking in this area, we will be:

- converting 2 regular parking spaces to loading zone spaces outside Ansonia Apartments, closest to Beeston Street
- reducing the existing loading zone between Saratoga and Ansonia Apartments to 4 loading zone spaces, and creating 2 new regular parking spaces.

Why are we doing this?

Council has listened to the feedback and concerns of the community about safety in this busy location, particularly for pedestrians.

Improvements as part of this project will:

- provide safer and more accessible pedestrian connections
- reduce corner cutting and encourage slower and safer vehicle movements
- improve visibility for all road users.

This project is part of our Local Access Network Improvements program, which focuses on important upgrades to ensure our suburbs are safe and accessible for people walking, riding and driving.
