# **Kelvin Grove Road and Lower Clifton Terrace** intersection upgrade – Red Hill

#### **Project introduction**

We are upgrading the Kelvin Grove Road and Lower Clifton Terrace intersection in Red Hill to improve the overall operation of the intersection, reduce congestion and enhance safety for people walking and riding through the area.

Kelvin Grove Road is an arterial road that caters to approximately 50,000 vehicles per day. The upgrade will adjust the traffic signal phasing and modify access from Lower Clifton Terrace improving traffic flow on Kelvin Grove Road.

This project is in conjunction with the upgrade completed at the Kelvin Grove Road and Blamey Street intersection, forming part of a wider corridor improvement.

#### **Project benefits**

- Reduce travel time and ease congestion.
- Improve efficiency of the overall intersection operation.
- Enhance safety and connectivity for people walking and riding.

#### **Project details**

Below is a summary of the works to be undertaken as part of the project.

- Upgrading the traffic signal phasing to extend the green time for traffic on Kelvin Grove Road.
- Changing the unsignalised access point at Lower Clifton Terrace and Kelvin Grove Road to left out only.
- Removing the signalised left turn from Lower Clifton Terrace into Kelvin Grove Road, changing access to right turn only.
- Upgrading the footpaths and kerb ramps at this intersection.
- Installing new pavement, line marking, landscaping and turf.

#### When will this work take place?

To reduce traffic impact and ensure the safety of residents, motorists and workers, works will be carried out at night when traffic demand on Kelvin Grove Road is lowest.

#### What does this mean for me?

If you live in or are travelling through the area, you may experience:

- increased noise, truck movements, vibration, dust and light from mobile light towers
- temporary traffic changes, including lane closures, minor traffic delays and reduced speed limits.

A site laydown area will be established during construction to temporarily store a site office, worker amenities, equipment and machinery.

## Travel north on Kelvin Grove Road from Lower Clifton Terrace

Follow Kelvin Grove Road North line marking and signage from Lower Clifton Terrace.

## Access to Lower Clifton Terrace from Kelvin Grove Road

Travel via Victoria Street, Scott Street and Musgrave Road.
