Toombul Road at St Vincents Road, Virginia Congestion Busting Project

Start of construction

What works are coming up?

Council is pleased to advise works to improve congestion at Toombul Road at St Vincents Road in Virginia will start soon.

Following assessment of traffic conditions in this area, we identified an opportunity to improve the right-turn capacity from Toombul Road into St Vincents Road.

When will this work take place?

Start	Underground services investigations will be undertaken on Thursday 3 April 2025. In the event of wet weather or unforeseen site conditions, investigations will be undertaken on the next available night. Construction will start in mid-April 2025.
Finish	Late May 2025, weather and site conditions permitting
Time and day	7pm to 5am, Sunday to Thursday

These works are required to be undertaken at night when traffic volumes are lowest, to ensure the safety of workers and road users and to minimise disruption.

What does this work include?

As part of these works, we will be:

- extending the northbound right turn lane from Toombul Road into St Vincents Road
- constructing new road pavement within the extended lane
- installing associated line marking, including right turning arrows
- removal and replanting of 2 trees
- minor turfing.

Why is this work happening?

This project will:

- reduce congestion by increasing capacity of the right turn lane from Toombul Road into St Vincents Road
- reduce queuing and delays
- improve travel times and trip reliability.

Council's **Congestion Busting Projects** are about helping people get home sooner and safer on roads that have higher volumes of traffic.

These projects aim to improve the performance of Brisbane's road network. Locations are chosen based on a number of factors including safety, visibility and overall network efficiency.

What does this mean for me?

If you live in or are travelling through the area, you may notice:

- increased noise, dust, vibration and vehicle movements
- changed traffic conditions, including minor delays, reduced speed limits and lane closures
- traffic controllers and signage on site.
