

# Wynnum Road and Hemmant-Tingalpa Road intersection upgrade

Detailed design | December 2024

Brisbane City Council has finalised the detailed design for the Wynnum Road and Hemmant-Tingalpa Road intersection upgrade at Tingalpa.

## Project overview

The upgrade involves installing traffic lights at the intersection to control all movements which will improve safety for road users.

In late 2023, we released a concept design and invited you to have your say by providing feedback on the design. Thank you to everyone who provided feedback. What we heard was that pedestrian crossing facilities and retaining the U-turn facility at this intersection is important. This feedback has been considered as part of finalising the detailed design.

## Why is this work happening?

Between 2016 and 2023, there were 10 crashes recorded at this intersection, 9 of the crashes resulted in medical treatment or hospitalisation.

High traffic volumes and extended wait times at the intersection contribute to motorists misjudging safe gaps in traffic when turning into and out of Hemmant-Tingalpa Road.

## Early works

Early works to relocate essential public utility infrastructure will start from mid-January 2025. These works will be undertaken at night, when traffic volumes are lowest.

If your property is affected, you will be notified at least 48 hours prior to any interruption taking place as part of the works.

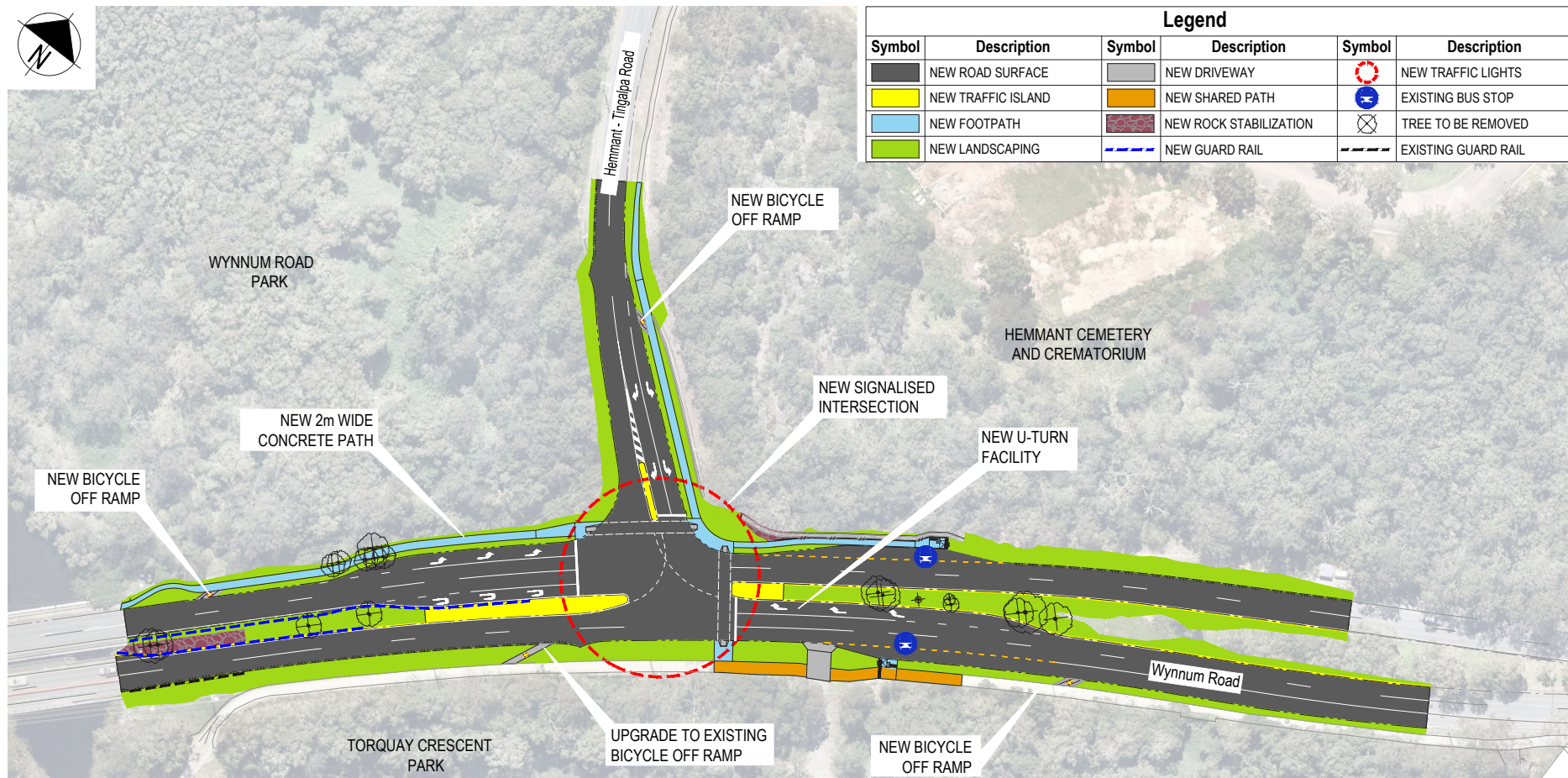

# Wynnum Road and Hemmant-Tingalpa Road intersection upgrade



## Project details

- New traffic lights with signalised crossing facilities to control all movements, improving safety for all road users.
- Modifying the traffic islands on Wynnum Road and constructing dedicated turn pockets on all approaches to the intersection to separate turning vehicles from through traffic.
- Installing a new section of footpath along Hemmant-Tingalpa Road to improve connectivity for people walking and riding.
- A new dedicated pocket with a signalised U-turn provision for vehicles travelling in both directions along Wynnum Road.
- Upgrading footpaths and kerb ramps, line marking and landscaping.
