
Flood Awareness Maps

The Flood Awareness Maps help Brisbane's residents and businesses understand their flood risk so they can be better prepared. The maps show rarer and more extreme flood events and are based on the likelihood of a flood occurring from one of more sources of flooding, including overland flow.



FloodWise Property Report

The FloodWise Property Report is a property-specific technical report that shows building and development flags, habitable floor levels, ground levels, flood levels and sources of flooding for a specific property or lot to enable you to plan and build based on legislated requirements in the Brisbane City Plan.

All Brisbane residents and businesses should use the flood awareness maps to understand their flood risk and the sources of flooding that may affect their home, business or property.
