A message from Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner

The newly-completed upgrade of Kingsford Smith Drive is showcasing our beautiful city as the new gateway to Brisbane. This major arterial will help future-proof growth in the northern corridor and provide a new expansive riverwalk and cycleway for wider community use.

Kingsford Smith Drive has been delivered well under budget which has allowed us to offer a special one-off rebate to ratepayers of about \$30 off your next rate notice from 1 January next year. This is extra help for residents, businesses and community groups experiencing hardship.

We're also continuing to back small business with the opening of the Brisbane Business Hub, a dynamic and friendly space in the CBD for established and budding small business owners to kickstart their recovery post-COVID.

Some of our biggest city-shaping projects are underway, helping streamline Brisbane's economic recovery and giving way to local supplier and job opportunities. Early works are underway on Brisbane Metro and residents are encouraged to give their feedback on our proposed green bridges and transport proposals for Brisbane's growing north western suburbs.

Meanwhile, our KittyCats will purr down the Brisbane River this November and service our cross-river and CityHopper routes.

Citywide projects boosting local jobs

We're investing \$11.7 million in government funding to upgrade community facilities and infrastructure citywide, supporting local jobs and helping our economy bounce back from the coronavirus pandemic.

Roof repairs to Mt Coot-tha's heritage-listed Summit Restaurant, sports field lighting, safety repairs across 60 sporting clubs, painting and maintenance at Council's environment centres and libraries, and stage repairs in Queen Street Mall are just some of the 24 projects supported by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

The projects will create supplier opportunities for local businesses and help maintain the local community lifestyle we love.





We're moving full steam ahead on a range of major projects to boost jobs and supplier opportunities and to plan for Brisbane's future growth.

This month, consultation begins on two new green bridges for West End and the north west transport network. Our new KittyCats will be making a splash too.

Brisbane Metro is moving forward, after reaching agreement with State Government to further progress the design for the major infrastructure.

Improving safety on our roads

We're improving safety for all road users by upgrading four traffic black spots in Wacol, Belmont, St Lucia and Annerley.

The Federal Government's Black Spot Program will fund the installation of traffic signals and roundabouts at these high-risk crash zones. The first upgrade will be on the London Road and Stanbrough Road black spot in Belmont, where we'll replace the existing stop signs with a roundabout.

These projects follow past upgrades including the Old Cleveland Road and Leicester Street black spot at Coorparoo, which has resulted in no recorded accidents since completion in 2017.

Slam dunk for community sport

Council is supporting local sport with a range of projects and initiatives.

Across Brisbane more than 550 sports fields will get upgrades from our Sports Field Improvement Program, helping community organisations to improve field conditions and turf coverage.

In Sunnybank, our \$1 million investment in a new FIFA-grade synthetic multi-sports field is complete and kicking goals.

Through Council's Inclusive Brisbane Plan, selected sporting clubs, including North Brisbane Rugby Union Club in Wavell Heights and Easts Mt Gravatt Junior Rugby League Club in Mansfield, will get accessibility upgrades for parking and entrances, new paths and unisex accessible toilets.

These upgrades follow Council's one-off \$5000 water rebate to eligible sports clubs and the Lord Mayor's \$3 million COVID-19 Direct Assistance Program, which helped not-for-profit lessees during coronavirus-related closures.

\$30 SAVINGS ON GREEN BINS



Congratulations to Earnshaw State College and its Green Heart Schools Student Environmental Leadership Network (SELN) representatives, Ryan Abraham and Maddie Sheahan (pictured) for inspiring their community to keep Brisbane clean and green.

This year, 34 schools and 79 students participated in SELN, Council's learning and leadership program that empowers young leaders to create change in their school community.

Ryan and Maddie, along with their student environment group, introduced a new recycling system linking the school's waste disposal stations to the Containers for Change scheme. They also gave assembly presentations and produced motivational videos and posters.

Water-saving tips for home

As dam levels drop and the mercury rises, try these tips to save water:

- > Water your garden at dawn or dusk.
- > Use a broom and not the hose for outdoor cleaning.
- > Only run the dishwasher and washing machine when full.
- > Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth and shaving.

Council is saving water by installing water efficient showers at pools, reusing storm or rainwater where possible and installing Smart Water Meters to monitor water use in real-time at more than 100 Council facilities.

Recycling made easy

When it comes to keeping our city clean and green, recycling is one of the easiest places to start.

This National Recycling Week (9-15 November), avoid the fuss by downloading Council's free Brisbane Bin and Recycling app, and feel confident you're putting the right thing in the right bin.

Discovering that plastic bags don't go in your recycling bin, but pizza boxes do, is easy with the app's search function. Whether at home, work or out and about, we can all do our bit to ensure valuable resources are recovered instead of wasted in landfill.

Look out - local wildlife about!

Keep an eye to the sky for swooping birds until December, as our native birds guard nests of chicks for about six weeks after hatching.

Be aware of known hotspots in your 'hood, which can often be marked with a warning sign. For tips on how to avoid protective plovers, magpies, butcherbirds, crows and pee-wees, search 'swooping birds' on our website.

The warmer weather has other local wildlife out and about too. If you see injured or orphaned native wildlife, call RSPCA on 1300 264 625 in the first instance or call Council on 3403 8888 and ask for help from our animal ambulance.


Cannon Hill golf course construction tees off

Brisbane's first new public golf course in more than 70 years is under construction as part of the Cannon Hill Community Links project. It's the first of its kind on the southside, joining the ever-popular St Lucia golf course by offering something for everyone.

Championship enthusiasts will have a new 18-hole course, while golf newbies can start on two nine-hole courses and a shorter six-hole course.

With project completion expected in 2022, locals can look forward to more to see and do close to home.

Council has been working closely with Urbex (a BMD company), who designed the project, to begin construction.
