


## Project features

### New facilities for pedestrians and cyclists

Council is committed to improving walking and cycling facilities in the local community as part of the upgrade. A key aspect will be building a new underpass at Cabbage Tree Creek to improve safety and access for pedestrians and cyclists.

This underpass will connect directly into the Cabbage Tree Creek bikeway with new lighting and planting throughout, including extensive use of native plants.




### Stage 2 between Dorville Road to Cowie Road. This will involve:

- installing new traffic lights at the Cowie Road intersection, including signalised pedestrian crossings at Cowie Road and on the eastern approach of Beams Road, and U-turn facilities on the eastern and western approaches on Beams Road
- installing a raised centre median to separate opposing lanes of traffic
- converting Bangalore Street and Tullamore Street into left-in, left-out access
- the inclusion of wide kerbside lanes for cyclists
- providing improved connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists.

### Stage 3 between Cowie Road to Lacey Road. This stage will involve:

- upgrading traffic lights at the Lacey Road intersection to improve safety and overall intersection operation
- increasing the capacity of the right-turn lanes into Lacey Road
- installing a raised centre median to separate opposing lanes of traffic
- the inclusion of wide kerbside lanes for cyclists
- providing improved connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists.

### Beams Road open level crossing

The Queensland Government is planning an open level crossing upgrade, located within Stage 1 of the Beams Road Upgrade. The open level crossing project involves replacing the level crossing on Beams Road with an overpass, as well as upgrading the intersections at Beams Road, Balacara Avenue and Plaza Place, and Beams Road, Carselgrove Avenue and Golden Place. Council is committed to working with TMR during the design and delivery of this project.

### Next steps

Council is finalising the detailed design for the corridor, which is expected to be complete in late 2021. Early works are expected to start in early 2022 in preparation for main construction works for Stage 1.

More information about construction, expected to start in mid-2022, will be provided to the community closer to the start of works. Council will also provide more information about future stages as the project progresses.

### Brisbane City Council is pleased to share with you the preliminary design for the Beams Road Upgrade (Lacey Road to Handford Road).

#### Project overview

The Beams Road corridor upgrade will improve safety for all road users and ensure you get home sooner. Beams Road is an important connection serving multiple communities across Carseldine, Fitzgibbon, Taigum and Zillmere. These areas are expected to experience significant growth and development over the coming years, putting more pressure on this busy road.

The upgrade will also improve active transport in the area and will include a combination of upgraded and new walking and cycling facilities.

#### Benefits

- Beams Road will be upgraded in three stages, and will:
- improve safety for all road users
- reduce traffic congestion
- improve travel time and reliability
- improve connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists.

## Project features

### The Beams Road Upgrade will be delivered in three stages.

#### Stage 1 of the corridor upgrade from Handford Road to Dorville Road including:

- providing dedicated left turning lanes on the northern and southern approaches of Handford Road and on the western approach of Beams Road
- upgrading sections of Beams Road from two lanes to four lanes to create a consistent four-lane corridor
- installing a new underpass at Cabbage Tree Creek for pedestrians and cyclists
- replacing the roundabout at the Dorville Road and Beams Road intersection with traffic lights
- installing a raised centre median to separate opposing lanes of traffic
- providing shared pathways from Handford Road to Lacey Road
- upgrading public utilities from Handford Road to Lacey Road.



### Dorville Road intersection

The Dorville Road roundabout will be replaced with a signalised intersection to improve pedestrian and cyclist safety and reduce crashes. This will include dedicated turning lanes, signalised pedestrian crossings and upgraded paths.

A slip lane will be installed on the southern side approach to the intersection, turning west into Beams Road. Two-aspect (orange and red) signals will be installed on the slip lane to help pedestrians and cyclists cross safely.


