The bowls club on the site is home to a theatre collective and venue that focuses on providing support to young artists, fringe arts works and First Nations artists trying to find a foothold in the arts, to lose this would be a great disappointment to local artists, the cultural hubs of Brisbane theatre, music and performance and the greater community generally.

The East Brisbane Bowls Club is leased to Backbone - an amazing organisation that provides a hub for Brisbane experimental music and art. Please consider the effects that the proposed development will have on this rare and valuable institution.

Knocking down the bowls club? Ridiculous! No replacement offered for Backbone Youth Arts, an invaluable contributor to the local arts community? Just awful. The justification for it is allegedly that a few residents think the building looks a bit ugly? Where is your source for this information? This is obviously a thinly veiled attempt to clear the space for future development for profit and the fact you have given people roughly a month to respond to this ludicrous proposal is disgustingly underhanded. Backbone is a fantastic and important venue, to say it is "under-utilised" is a ridiculous lie.

The proposed demolition of the East Brisbane Bowls Club, currently the home of Backbone Youth Arts, would be a massive loss to not only the arts landscape in QLD, but to the number of different communities who use Backbone as a safe space to create, connect and entertain. Backbone
serves as a hub of many collectives and individual artists, particularly emerging artists, who have already suffered a number of losses due to funding cuts/redirection of funds. The space Backbone provides, most of the time at no cost to emerging artists, is an incredibly valuable asset, and their space is one of the only accessible to young artists in Brisbane. Bulldozing their home would, again, be an enormous loss to Brisbane, and I implore the council to keep the bowls club as a part of Mowbray Park.

No - the proposal soundns great

I would love to see the Bowls Club retained. As one of the few community examples of mid century architecture still accessible to the public in Brisbane, I believe it should be valued and preserved as an important and historic structure. It would be very shortsighted and against all international trends towards embracing and recognising the significance of Post War design. In addition, it currently acts as a vibrant cultural hub which engages with all levels of community. Please, please use this opportunity to preserve and not destroy Brisbane's fast vanishing built heritage.

Backbone is currently in residence at the old East Brisbane bowls club and they are a vital component of the East Brisbane community, and the arts sector locally, nationally and internationally. I would like to see a considerable and long term investment into this organization and the venue it calls home. Backbone is integral to the arts and is Brisbane's hub of artist development and
support. There is no future artists in
Brisbane without backbone.
Backbone alumni are leaders in the arts and entertainment, and lead organizations such as Brisbane Festival (Sch4P44s6 and PACT
Sch4Pt4s6. Backbone is a home to many communities. It is a hub for creativity and rarely goes unused. If certain community members believe it is not in use, they are simply not paying attention (and quite frankly, a venue with this many live performance events that has such little noise complaints in the heart of East Brisbane is golden, don't you think?). Backbone is vital to the ongoing vision of Brisbane being a new world city, a vibrant creative city, a well designed city, and a safe friendly city. Please invest in the upgrade of this venue and support of this organization. It is imperative for young people, families, young and independent artists, and Brisbane citizens alike.

I cannot emphasise enough how much I DO NOT support even the mere consideration of replacing the bowls club site to add more green space. While enhancing the park area in general is a great idea, the bowls club has been used as an independent arts space for years now, called Backbone, and l've been able to see and and enjoy many performances and showings there. It's been a great place for up and coming Brisbane artists to have the opportunity to exhibit their shows, where a number of them have gone on to perform at larger Brisbane venues, such as the Powerhouse. There's hardly any overwhelming amount of independent art spaces in and around Brisbane as it is, so proposing the removal of one -
especially along a Riverside that has seen countless apartment buildings go up that haven't even been filled is kind of an insult to the creative community of Brisbane, telling them "Hey actually we don't really care about you." Not only that, but rejuvenating the green space surrounding the bowls club is the perfect opportunity for the park and the creative space to work in concert with each other. A better and more inviting green space surrounding it will bring more exposure to the shows being put on at Backbone, which in turn would allow them to put on more shows for the community. Hell, maybe investing some of that park money in rejuvenating the bowls club area would make it an additional selling point for the space. And even if you want to look at it from a purely selfish political perspective supporting both the environment AND the arts? That's the kind of thing you slap on a resume to get you votes.

For the last decade Backbone Youth Arts has been home to not just East Brisbane Bowls Club but for artists and audiences of Brisbane it is an affordable venue, an artistic hub and an ally and advocate for LGBTQI+ peoples (their all genders bathrooms were an change making force for
many public/private spaces). You
would be hard pressed to find a performer in Brisbane who hasn't been associated with or had the helping hand of Backbone through their affordable rehearsal space, festivals, championing of new work and workshops (like "Girls Rock!", a female music mentoring program and showcase which is the only one of its kind in QLD). "Replacing" this venue would render already struggling Brisbane artists (and what they bring to the community through comedy, education, protest and connection) completely abandoned and broken hearted. The Bowls Club is a place for young people to develop ideas, develop skills and develop their art. It may not be the most flash building in the city but it doesn't have to be. It serves as a place for people who may not fit the traditional social mould to actually be accepted and encouraged to express themselves personally and creatively. There are so many underage artists in Brisbane who cannot express themselves properly due to a lack of venues that accept them. 2019 Qube Effect finalists The Blockades performed several times at the Bowls Club allowing their primary fan base of underage punters to actually see them play. Most of the time they would be forced to play at a pub or club in which a majority of their following were not permitted entry due to liquor licensing laws. The Bowls Club was the only place where they could play to people who weren't twice their age. The East Brisbane Bowls Club, or Backbone as it is called by all of us, is vital in the development of young artists. It truly earns the name Backbone, because without it there would be no support for young artists who aren't traditional pop trite. It is an important place for teens and young adults to hone their craft. To tear it down would be a mistake that could set back the arts scene in Brisbane for years.

Though you mention the possibility of moving Backbone to another venue, the site at EBBC is extremely accessible and inclusive public transport is decent, there is a carpark for artists and crew to load in from, and it's wheelchair accessible. Perhaps the bowling green can be sacrificed for green space, basketball courts, or a skate park, but the building itself is an integral part of our local community. The loss of EBBC would be a huge detriment to not only to the community of East Brisbane \& surrounds and local artists \& punters from across the city, but also to BCC's image.

I do agree that the old bowling greens could be upgraded to be used as a green area for activities for local residents. As that space is large and not being used it could definitely be changed to make that space active again, but I truly believe demolishing the building and the venue existing within it, would be a great loss to Brisbane. It was also that venue that introduced to Mowbray Park (and i'm sure many others) when I attended a small local music festival there a few years ago. Now I go to the park from time to time and take others there who haven't experienced it.

I understand the council's decision to offer a lease to Backbone in Seven Hills to mitigate and replace this venue for youth arts, but this decision and attempted

Club building as I believe it is performing a useful function for Brisbane youth. I believe the alternatives discussed (Seven Hills Performance Centre), is less accessible (fewer Public transport options and less frequency of services) and less likely to attract inner-City youth. The music performances are not disruptive while living close by and no louder than a Gabba concert or game. The attendees are less obtrusive than Gabba patrons as most do not drive (and do not clog local streets).

The plans to remove the bowls club building that is currently in use as Backbone Youth Arts Centre is an idea which, if implemented, would damage the Brisbane cultural community and subsequently the Brisbane community as a whole. For this reason it should not be implemented by the Brisbane City Council. Rather, the green space currently included connected with the bowls club building could be opened up to the public and renovated accordingly with public needs of access in mind, while maintaining the building together with its current functions.

Relocation of Backbone Youth Arts and the demolition of the bowls club. There are few community arts spaces that are close to the city with good public transport facilities. The current space allows for music venue noise levels which I don't feel that the proposed new venue at Seven Hills will be able to cater for as it neighbours an aged care facility. I do not support the demolition of the exiting bowls club building. Firstly, it houses an important arts organisation. The idea of relocating the arts organisation to me feels unhelpful, as I believe that the location of the space is important for the arts community. It is easily accessible by ferry and it is far away from other arts venues such as those
in the Valley. Arts venues that are more emeshed in suburban life are important as they separate arts from drinking and club culture and foster community cohesion. Secondly, the demolition of buildings simply for the fact that theya are an eyesore is extremely wasteful, and is not an attitude that lends itself to an emerging city. Cities such as those in Europe and even a city like Melbourne are fashionable and interesting as they balance the importance of heritage and history with new technologies and fresh outlooks. The style of building that houses the bowls club and backbone youth arts is also currently fashionable in its design. Replacement of windows, railings and a repaint as well as a revamp of interiors would actually create a very fresh and retro look to the space. It is also ideal for an arts space as it is along a main road, not close to houses - so no fear of noise complaints. I would not be surprised if backbone is moved to a new location only to have nearby residents complain about noise, ruining the chances for having music and theatre events at night time. I also believe that nearby residents who initially pointed out a distaste for the centre would possibly change their minds if they were able to hold events of their own there. It is easy to dislike from the outside, but a very useful space once people actually take the time to look inside. Thirdly, if buildings are constantly knocked down, people have no way to connect with the memories they had within those walls. This creates a disjointed feeling throughout the community as people are constantly shuffled from one community space
to another, losing connections along the way. Once again, a disjointed community will not create the kind of city that I believe council are trying to create. What is the point of a new park if it comes by erasing memories already created there?

A combined cyclist and pedestrian pathway - just not safe with playground so close

More lighting means using more electricity. If there was to be more lighting I think it should be solar. The Bowls club is an integral part of the Brisbane arts, music and theatre scene. It needs to stay. It is a part of Brisbane history and the architecture is unique. A slight refurbishment to the outside would make the building a feature of the park. If more green space is really needed the carpark should be moved up towards the road and the area news the river grassed. People would actually sit near the river whereas they wouldn't sit near a major road.

Less grass, more plants and shade.

I do not support the demolition of the former East Brisbane Lawn Bowls club or the relocation of Backbone Youth Arts. The former EBLB clubhouse is a community owned asset and represents a significant part of the sport and recreational heritage of Brisbane. I would rather see public money spent on cosmetically improving the clubhouse than demolition. The proposed option of relocating Backbone Youth Arts to Seven Hills does not provide the same access for young people and is located near an aged care facility. Backbone Youth Arts have

I acknowledge that the topography of Mowbray park presents design challenges. I think the proposed connection between the former bowls club and existing park area via grass terraces is a good design solution $(5,7)$. I believe that the addition of the bandstand may attract anti-social behaviour due to the lack of causal surveillance from neighbouring streets/roads. Other suggestions: Consider establishing a recreation zone toward the river adjacent to BBQ areas. This would involve relocating the existing playground and expanding it beneath the fig trees (New Farm park could be considered as an exemplar). This would concentrate families, elderly and other groups in this zone and avoid carving up the premium views area with a commuting path. A play traffic road (similar to Colmslie reserve) could then be established at the existing playground site. Bikes are dangerous in Mowbray park. We
ourselves are commuting cyclists and we cannot understand why bikes are still cutting through the park despite the new cycling corridor being recently established along Lytton road (this area was removed from the park). How can the council justify the complete uprooting of a space that provides a valuable service to the community and the arts? The council claims the building is an eyesore; and yet, it refuses to provide the funding to renovate the space and improve the way it looks. The council claims that the space is underutilised, especially the bowling greens; and yet, Backbone is constantly holding events, and is also prevented from using the greens due to onerous noise restrictions. The council claims that local residents want the space gone; and yet, they refuse to release the actual data backing this claim up, and the council workers I spoke to at the most recent in-person consultation said that they had received no such feedback. Uprooting and scattering Backbone at a new, inferior location would be an absolute travesty, and I am appalled that council would even consider such a thing.

Please do not remove Backbone from their space and do not disregard the beautiful mid century building.

Save the bowls club! It's a space for all people!!!
